<u>"Visions of Faith" Stained Glass Restoration Project</u> – by this point, I hope that you have been able to see and appreciate the scope of work that we undertook for the preservation and on-going care of the notable works of visual art that accompany us every time we gather for prayer and worship. On a sunny day, the ever-changing wash of radiant colors in the interior is transcendent and the remarkable colors are all the more vivid when church is lit for prayer at night. Although there remains some smaller aspects that still need attention (like interior plaster and woodwork repair), I am pleased to inform you that this project has been fully funded because of your generosity. Shortly, letters will be sent to all "Visions of Faith" donors so that the correct wording on the commemoration plaque can be created. Many thanks to all who contributed.

The Pfeffer Pipe Organ – this past week, a letter from the Bishop was received giving permission for the Quimby Pipe Organ Company of Warrensburg, Missouri to restore of our historic 1897 Pfeffer pipe organ. During the past couple of years, the Quimby Company, as well as the Bedient Company of Roca, Nebraska and Dobson Company of Lake City, Iowa, were invited to inspect and offer their ideas about the 'dust-laden maiden' sitting in our loft. All of these firms are members of APOBA (Associated Pipe Organ Builders of America). Further information can be found at *apoba.com*.

As was previously indicated in this forum, an unexpected and generous bequest was recently received by St. Thomas the Apostle Parish in memory of Rose Schmidt specifically for the restoration of the historically significant instrument in the loft. Nevertheless, some might wonder "so what?" about the neglected instrument that is in our parish. Might I offer some historical perspective on this rare instrument that had been an integral part of the liturgical life of our parish for so many decades. Johann Georg Pfeffer immigrated to the United States in 1854 from Sigmaringen (present day southwestern Germany), where he had learned the pipe organ building trade. Having settled in St. Louis in 1859, Mr. Pfeffer quickly established himself as one of the city's most prominent organbuilders. Although a comprehensive list of all of the pipe organs constructed by Mr. Pfeffer is not known to exist, it is estimated that his company in St. Louis constructed almost 600 instruments around the country. At this point in history, fewer than 50 Pfeffer instruments are known to exist anywhere, and very few in an unaltered condition – which is the case with our instrument at St. Thomas. In other words, all of the key action and all of the nearly 500 original hand-crafted wood and metal pipes are present and accounted for. To quote one of the proposals, "...it is arguable in the finest condition of any organ its age that we have ever inspected."

<u>Parish Sesquicentennial</u> – as you hopefully know by now, in 2019 St. Thomas the Apostle Parish will be celebrating 150 years since it was formally established as a canonical parish. With that great anniversary just a few years away, I have two questions to ask you:

What would ideas do you have for commemorating this important milestone?

What is the next project in church that you would like to see attended to?

# A MESSAGE FROM THE DIOCESAN DIRECTOR OF CHILD AND YOUTH PROTECTION

You may be aware of a movie soon to be released that chronicles the *Boston Globe*'s investigation and subsequent reporting in 2002 of the child sexual abuse scandal in the Archdiocese of Boston. The following are some things to consider in light of the movie's release:

☐ The sexual abuse scandal has been a difficult, painful moment in the Church's history. It has been painful for victims/
survivors, painful for their families and painful for the Church.
□ Because of the courage of victims/survivors, this issue was brought to light.
☐ Since 2002, the Catholic Church has taken numerous steps to address child sexual abuse:

- a. Created the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People
- b. Supported better understanding of abuse through research (Nature and Scope and Causes and Context)
- c. Continues to take a greater role, both within the Church and in society, in the prevention of child sexual abuse through education and awareness
- d. Pope Francis has created a Pontifical Commission to address the issue world-wide.
- □ Child sexual abuse is still prevalent in our society. Studies suggest that 1 out of 4 girls and 1 out of 6 boys are sexually abused before their 18th birthday. Child sexual abuse continues to happen in our society, and this is a reminder that we cannot afford to become complacent.
- □ Victims/survivors may be reminded of traumatic events in their lives by the movie. Providing support to all abuse victims is an act of charity and love we are called to provide.
- ☐ The Church teaches that all human life is precious and is to be protected at all levels.

### What we have done in The Diocese of Jefferson City:

□ Our diocese has participated in each annual Charter audit and has been found compliant with the Charter following each audit. Following the close of the current audit period (June 30, 2016) we will publish an annual report providing an update on the year's activities.

□ Our diocese has participated each year in the survey conducted by CARA, which provides an annual report regarding allegations of abuse, child and youth protection efforts, and victim assistance efforts in our country.

□ From March 1, 2003 to June 30, 2015 we have conducted 588 *Protecting God's Children* classes in the diocese. Through these classes, 13,820 adults have been given the education and resources to help keep children in our diocese safe.

□ We provided education and training to over six thousand students in our Catholic schools and PSR programs during the past year. This training provides our youth with the knowledge and tools they need to stay safe.

□ While numbers are not available for the period 2003-2006, since July 2007 we have conducted over 8400 background checks on employees and volunteers.

☐ We continue to work with victims/survivors of abuse to assist them in their healing process.

□ Individuals and organizations outside of the Church are now looking to our diocese to provide support in educating about child abuse awareness and prevention.
