This collection was instituted years ago to replace the Fall Festival which St. Thomas Parish use to have. It is part of our overall parish budget, helping with ongoing expenses.

"VISIONS OF FAITH" STAINED GLASS WINDOW RESTORATION: The restoration work on the St. Thomas stained glass windows is into its fifth full week. As you have hopefully noticed, the new ¼" tempered protective glass has been installed on the south side of church and on a portion of the north side. We are still waiting for the remaining pieces of protective glass to be fired, cut and delivered. The total cost of the window restoration and repair project will be approximately \$95,000, as there has been the need to replace a number of sills and all of the rotted exterior trim which had been covered by aluminum flashing. Close to \$90,000 has been donated for this important project. Any and all further contributions to this project are greatly appreciated. A single commemoration plaque will be created to list the names (or memorial) of all who have contributed to the restoration project. If you have questions, please contact Fr. Secrist.

<u>PFEFFER PIPE ORGAN RESTORATION</u>: This past Thursday was the Feast of St. Thérèse of Lisieux (also known as the "Little Flower"). On her deathbed she declared that she would spend her time in heaven "doing good on earth" and that she would "let fall from heaven a shower of roses." Many, many times since her death, her intercession has been marked by roses. St. Thérèse recently interceded for our Parish of St. Thomas the Apostle, as a generous bequest in memory of Rose Schmidt was received specifically for the restoration of the Pfeffer organ, which just happened to have been constructed in 1897…the year of the Little Flower's passage into eternity. — Fr. Secrist
